

How strict is WestJet with carry-on? WestJet Policy

When flying with WestJet, understanding the airline's carry-on policies is crucial to avoid unnecessary stress at the airport. WestJet allows passengers to bring **one standard carry-on bag** and **one personal item** on board. A standard carry-on must fit in the overhead bin and should not exceed **23 cm x 40 cm x 55 cm (9 in x 15.5 in x 21.5 in)**, including handles and wheels. Personal items, such as a backpack, laptop bag, or purse, should fit under the seat in front of you.

WestJet is generally **strict about enforcing these size and quantity limits**. If your carry-on is too large or if you exceed the allowed number of items, you may be asked to **check the bag at the gate**, which could incur additional fees. Overhead bin space can also be limited, so even if your bag technically meets the size requirements, gate agents may ask passengers with oversized or heavier bags to check them.

Weight restrictions are also in place for certain fare types. For example, **Basic fare passengers may face stricter weight limitations** than those traveling in Premium or Plus fare classes. It's always a good idea to **weigh your carry-on before arriving at the airport** to avoid surprises.

WestJet's approach is generally **consistent but fair**, with gate agents enforcing policies to ensure safety and comfort for all passengers. Travelers who pack efficiently, measure their bags, and follow the rules usually have a smooth experience.

For those who want to maximize carry-on allowance, consider **packing strategically**, using compact luggage, and keeping personal items within size
